

TRAIL MAP LEGEND

ATTENTION SKIERS AND SNOWBOARDERS

Please review this safety information and study mountain and weather conditions.

Be advised that all poles, flags, fencing, signage and padding on equipment or objects or other forms of marking devices are used by the area to inform you of the presence or location of a potential obstacle or hazard. These markers are no guarantee of your safety and will not protect you from injury. It is part of your responsibility under Your Responsibility Code to avoid all obstacles or hazards, including those that are so marked.

Be advised that to board a lift is not allowed without sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to negotiate or to use such lift safely. Using a lift or any area trail when under the influence of drugs or alcohol is not allowed. Loading and unloading procedures are posted at the base of each lift.

- If you are unfamiliar with the area
- Begin with runs marked Easiest
 - Progress to less Difficult
 - Advance to More Difficult
 - If ability allows, use Most Difficult
 - Very experienced, use Expert

This system of difficulty markers is relative and only valid at this area. This system is not necessarily the same as a similarly rated trail at another area. Skiers/boarders should begin with the easiest trails regardless of ability level, until familiar with the trails at the area. During periods of low visibility or other inclement weather and snow conditions, the degree of difficulty of the ski/snowboard runs may change.

Please observe the posted SLOW ZONE areas by maintaining a speed no faster than the general flow of traffic. Fast and aggressive skiing/snowboarding will not be tolerated.

Alyeska Resort is committed to promoting slope safety. Slope users include alpine skiers, telemark skiers, snowboarders and those with disabilities and/or specialized equipment. Always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in skiing/boarding that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Know your ability level and stay within it.

THE RESPONSIBILITY CODE

- Always stay in control, and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- You must not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above.
- Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.

Alyeska's Mountain Learning Center provides exemplary and complete standards-based education available for privates, groups, and all ability levels. Our instructors are certified by Professional Ski Instructors of America (PSIA) and the American Association of Snowboard Instructors. Private clinics are available for children ages 2-4 and group lessons for ages 5 and above. Emphasis is based on cooperative, hands-on, theme based learning

LEARN TO RIDE PROGRAM

ALYESKA SKI PATROL

Alyeska's boundary is closed and may not be crossed, except where signage permits. Much of Alyeska's boundary is defined by avalanche prone areas. Entering these areas can result in serious injury or death and can endanger you as well as others. You may be fined by the State of Alaska if you enter a closed area.

In case of injury, cross your skis above the accident scene and have another individual contact the Alyeska Ski Patrol. Ski Patrol members can be identified with red parkas marked with a white cross, or stop at any chairlift terminal.

First Aid stations are located at the base of Mt. Alyeska near Chair 4, the top of Mt. Alyeska near the top of Chair 6 and in the historic Roundhouse next to the Upper Glacier Terminal.

Alyeska Resort is equipped with the RECCO® locator system. Ski Patrol carries avalanche beacons on 457 frequency only.

LIFT TICKETS

These may be purchased at the ticket window or ticket kiosk located either at the Daylodge or on the second floor of The Hotel Alyeska.
